The death of Mrs Bolder, a resident of Rushworth, took place on Monday last under somewhat distressing circumstances.

Deceased had been ailing for a considerable time and was eventually taken to a hospital in Melbourne. It was while on this journey in Melbourne that her husband (Mr Alf. Bolger) contracted a heavy cold, which was followed by more serious developments and culminated in his death a few days later, viz. on the 19th of March last.

Mrs Bolger remained in hospital from then on, but when it was found that there was no hope for her, it was resolved to bring her home, accordingly her brothers (W. and Simon Fraser) proceeded to Melbourne with that object, returning Monday last.

Deceased was then very low, and when the train had reached a point within about two miles of Rushworth she quietly passed away.

Thus father and mother have passed away within two short months. The family consisted of one child only, a girl about 17 years of age, and to her is extended every sympathy in her sad trouble.

Mrs Bolger was but 41 years of age, and suffered from an internal complaint.

The remains were interred in the local cemetery on Tuesday afternoon in the presence of a large number of sympathisers.

Rev. Father Tehan conducted the funeral service, and the mortuary arrangements were in the hands of Mr E. F. Anderson.
